Folding Screen of Divine Spirit

A folding screen on which you can attach the Divine Spirit (the principal image of the prayer card) that you receive at each temple.
It is available for purchase at each of the temples in Shikoku Twenty Sacred Sites.
*The photo is the finished product. When you purchase, the Divine Spirit (the principal image of the prayer card) is not included.
*Color Divine Spirit and ordinary Divine Spirit (black and white) are both available.

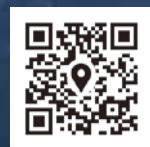
Recommend visiting Shikoku Twenty Sacred Sites

In addition to the eighty-eight sacred sites, Kobo Daishi left many other footprints to open the Shikoku sacred sites, and these sites have been a part of the history of the Shikoku pilgrimage and have been a source of faith for many people. The Shikoku Twenty Sacred Sites were established in 1868 by gathering twenty temples out of these sacred sites, and all these places are associated with the belief in Kobo Daishi and the establishment of the Shikoku sacred places. When the Shikoku twenty sacred sites are added to the eighty-eight sacred places, the total number of sacred places becomes one hundred and eight, and it is said that if you pray to these places in total, you will be able to extinguish the one hundred and eight vexations of human beings.

In addition, one of the pleasures of these twenty sacred sites is to receive nenju-dama (prayer beads) (with the temple's name on it) at each temple, and to complete the josai-shofuku-nenju (safe and blessed prayer beads), which will further deepen your relationship with Kobo Daishi.

Please visit the historical Shikoku Twenty Sacred Sites, which are decorated with various stories about Kobo Daishi.
